Chartwell School is seeking a Middle School Mathematics teacher to join our team. This position is open for the 2019-2020 academic year.

We are an independent school on the Monterey Peninsula in coastal California, approximately 100 miles south of San Francisco. For 35 years Chartwell has been serving students in grades 2-12, who have been identified as having dyslexia or related language-based learning differences. Class sizes are small and teachers individualize instruction while teaching to small groups.

The successful candidate is responsible for understanding student learning profiles and scaffolding instruction to meet the needs of individual students. A solid understanding of mathematics concepts and applications is necessary. Experience with technology and blended learning platforms and teaching practices is helpful. A special education credential is also desirable, but not required.

Chartwell offers a unique professional growth opportunity for teachers who want to grow their practice toward including an understanding of cognitive learning profiles and brain-based educational practices. Professional development is strongly supported by the school, as our culture values continuous learning and innovation of instructional practice to meet the unique needs of cognitively diverse learners.

Most importantly, we seek teachers who intuit that the central aspect of teaching is creating trusting and respectful relationships with all students.
